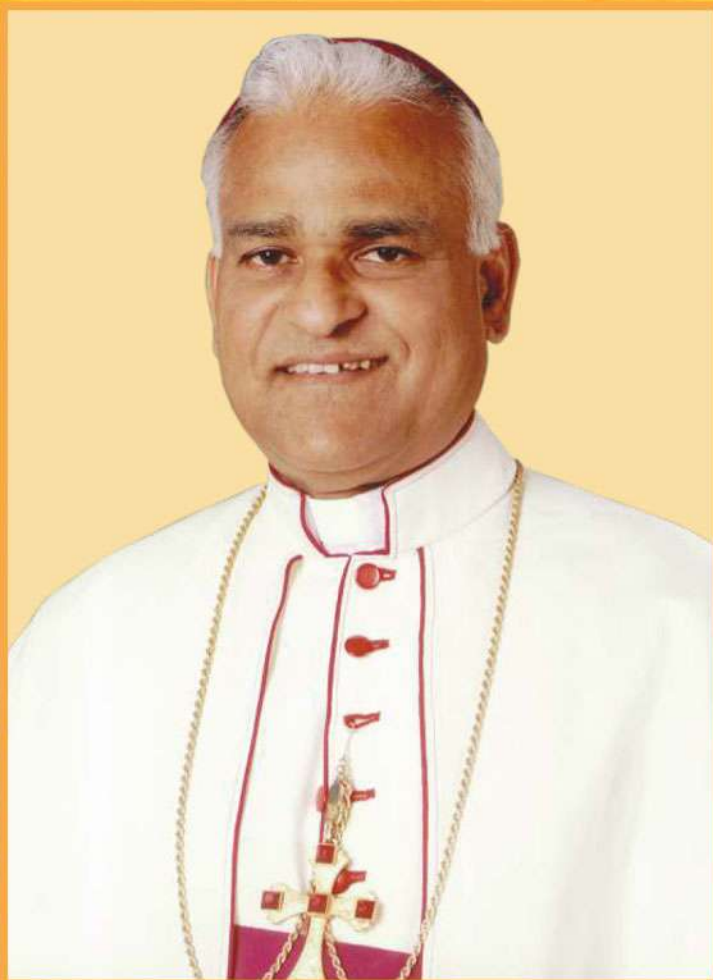

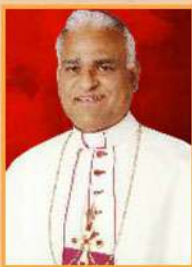

My experience as Principal in various institutions of repute would stand me in good stead in steering this College to greater heights.

Shaping young minds is one of the biggest challenges these days. At St. Peter's we aim to empower our students to grow as individuals with strong discerning minds and prepare them to make a mark as useful citizens of our proud nation in particular and of the world in general. Our distinctive academic and co-curricular programmes encourage the students to be mentally and physically fit, to develop personal and social values and to set goals to realise their unique potentials.

The academic year 2019-20 was highly fruitful and rewarding. With the benevolence of God and the co-operation of the staff, the parents and the students, we were able to conduct the affairs of the College with a reasonably high degree of success. We were able to maintain high standards, enforce discipline, encourage students to greater endeavour and strike a balance between tradition and innovation.

### **Academics**

The Unit, Terminal, Final and Board Examinations showed the importance the College places on studies. In the ICSE 2019 Examination 289 students appeared. Of them 119 got 90%. The topper was Prithvi Chauhan with 98%.

In the ISC 2019 our results were equally good. Of the 168 students that appeared 50 got 90%. Lakshya Bhardwaj and Shivam Tiwari were the toppers in the Science Stream with 98.75% and Kalptaru Agarwal in the Commerce Stream with 98.5% marks.

### **Annual Awards Day**

Annual Day was celebrated on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2019. The students staged a variety entertainment programme which won the plaudits of the audience. Mr. Rajarshi Dwivedi, Income Tax Commissioner of Agra, was the Chief Guest. Special prizes and awards were also given away. The most coveted Archbishop's Gold medal was won by Shivam Tiwari and the Principal's Silver medal by Kalptaru Agarwal.



### **Staff Enrichment Programme**

Going by the dictum "Teachers are also Learners," the College organized seminars for the staff. These seminars and workshops helped the staff to stay updated and cater to the needs of the students.

### **School Parliament**

In the College parliament election Anush Mangal was elected Prime Minister, Kartikey D. Gautam Cultural Captain; Harshit Chadha Deputy PM; Sambhav Jain Cabinet Secretary and Abith Binu Thomas Speaker. Mr. Lokesh Upadhyay, General Manager of Wyndham Hotel, Agra, was the Chief Guest.

### **Houses and clubs**

A Cultural Fest 'Eternia' is organized every year to awaken the dormant talents in the students. The four houses vied with one another to become the Cultural Champions of the academic year. Various inter-school competitions were also organized by different clubs. The Commerce Club organized 'B World'; Computer Club and Science Club jointly organized Techno-Fi. Eco Club undertook a plantation drive, Hindi Club organized 'Bhashotsav' and Music Club organized 'Renaissance'. These competitions provided our students ample opportunities to showcase their talents and nurture their leadership qualities.

### **Debates**

Under the auspices of the Debate Club, a slew of debates were held which honed the oratorical skills of our students.

The DLA inter-school English Debate for students of Classes XI and XII, DLA inter-school Hindi debate; Dr. R.G. Bansal memorial inter-school English Debate and Smt. Saroj Devi memorial inter-school English debate were held and in all of them our students proved their mettle. Our students also participated in various competitions hosted by different organizations and institutions in and outside the city.

# Transforming Education Awards 2019

Singularly devoid of anger and acrimony, not a word of reproach was heard from him even under the most trying circumstances. He never pointed an accusing finger at others. In his capacity as the House Master and Eco Club in-charge, he did everything to motivate, encourage and support the teachers and students. Soft spoken, disciplined to a fault, erudite yet self-effacing, he had immense patience. His uncompromising adherence to discipline has at times earned him the displeasure of students.

Kuttan sir had the ability to inspire his colleagues as well, by his simple righteous conduct. He maintained a good rapport with everyone irrespective of either seniority or age.

As for me and my family, he was a great friend who stood by us in times of need. Thrifty in his words, we used to get glimpses of his humour and repartee, and sometimes his melodious voice in our family get-togethers. We have seen and experienced his culinary skills as well. Whenever we visited his family, he along with his wife ma’am Lekha, plied us with hospitality.

I conclude quoting Shakespeare. “His life was gentle, and the elements so mixed in him that nature might stand up and say to all the world, this was a man.”

I, on behalf of the Principal and the teachers, wish him all the best and pray that he continues to inspire and motivate people who come in touch with him.

## Sr. Annie Flossy

Sr. Annie Flossy our former Headmistress, left for her heavenly abode on 1 September 2020, after ailing for some time. She was one of the senior most Sisters of the Franciscan Clarist Congregation. Her courage in the face of adversity was an inspiration to all those who knew her. She will be greatly missed.

Born on 18 March 1946 in Thrissur District, Kerala, she had her elementary education and passed her SSLC from Nalanda High School, Kizhuppullikkara; Hindi Vidwan from Kerala, PUC from Vidisha, M.P.; TTC from Allahabad Board, B.A. from Meerut university, B.Ed from Mitali University and M.A. in English Literature from SNDP University, Mumbai.

As headmistress from 1998-2001, she was keen on achieving a good academic record for St. Peter's. This desire was tempered by her belief that any child has the potency to do well in academics. She never hid her delight in people, meeting them and the school benefitted enormously from her talents as a good teacher and the ability to charm people. Her knowledge in English and Hindi was encyclopedic, her intellectual energy was astounding and remained unblunted. Her impact on people, especially her students and teachers was legendary. She loved the students and the students loved her.

As counsellor, she always had a soft smile that put the students at ease. She listened to the students closely and showed empathy. There was a natural friendliness in her. She garnered both affection and respect from the students.

She was totally dedicated to the pupils, parents, staff and had an amazing capacity to make anyone she met feel special.

She translated many of the Franciscan books from the vernacular language and English to Hindi which helped as guiding notes for the local vocations in her Province and the Congregation. Her missionary zeal and commitment to the entrusted duty, love for the Congregation made her immortal. She boldly proclaimed through her life the message to the coming generations to be docile to the Holy Spirit and trust in the Divine Providence in their words and deeds.

Responding to the call of the Lord, she joined the Franciscan Clarist Congregation at Thrissur on 15 June 1969, professed on 5 May 1971 and took the name of Annie Flossy and made her perpetual commitment on 4 May 1977. Sr. Flossy served in the Dioceses of Sagar, Meerut, Kalyan, Bijnor, Faridabad, Rajkot and Agra Archdiocese. She served the Congregation in the capacities of Teacher, Superior, Principal, Provincial Councillor and her administrative ability was commendable. The Hindi Medium School at Mandawaly in the Diocese of Bijnor where she was Principal for 16 years is a testimony to it. No wonder, it is a fulfillment of her motto to be with the least and the lost.

Sr. Flossy has fought a good fight, finished her race, kept the faith and has left for her eternal reward the Righteous Judge had reserved for her. May her soul Rest in Peace.

## Ronald Vivian Smith Passes Away

Ronald Vivian Smith, an alumnus of St. Peter's College, Agra (1943-1956) who had achieved fame as a chronicler of Delhi life, history and culture, passed away at his residence in Mayapuri, Delhi, on April 30, 2020. He was 82 and had been ailing for some time with a liver complaint; because of the lockdown, he was unable to get into a hospital for treatment.



Son of Thomas Smith, also an alumnus of St. Peter's (1923-28), Ronald passed out in 1956, whereafter he joined St John's College, Agra for his BA and MA. He opted for journalism as a career and joined the editorial staff of The Press Trust of India and later of The Statesman, New Delhi. He retired as News Editor of The Statesman in 1996 and thereafter spent all his time in walking through the lanes and bylanes of Delhi to gather material for his weekly column: "Quaint Corner" in The Statesman that appeared for 30 long years. Later he began a weekly column in The Hindu which continued till his death.

He also published a dozen books on the history and culture of Delhi, which earned him much popularity and fame. On his death Arvind Kejriwal, Chief Minister of Delhi tweeted:

"R V Smith, the chronicler of our great city Delhi passed away this morning. His work kept alive the stories and memories of our city. It's a great loss, especially for Delhites. My heartfelt condolences to family and friends."

The national newspapers carried the news of his death prominently on their front pages.

Ronald's interest in creative writing began while he was yet in school. He wrote a book of ghost stories in 1955 which was published locally. His strong attachment to St. Peter's continued till the very end and he would phone up his brother, Neville Smith, late in the night to confirm the names of two brothers, who stayed in the Senior Dormitory of St Peter's about whom he was writing a story that would take readers 65 years back. His memory did not let him down, as he often recalled his days in St Peter's with a hundred stories about the school and boys of his time.

Ronald's work, which included two volumes of poetry and a novel, made him known all over Delhi and beyond. It is a great achievement for a Peterite and St Peter's is proud of him.

Incidentally, Dr Neville Smith's wife, Dr. Anugrah May Smith, also died; she on March 4 of complications following a kidney ailment. She was 70. She taught for 27 years in St. Patrick's Junior College, Agra and was known for her sense of duty, teaching, discipline and production of nativity plays, some of which were performed before foreign guests in a local hotel.

## Constraints of Cloud Classes



It was nothing more than an insignificant news to be read and forgotten in 'The Hindu'; "China informed WHO on December 31, 2019 about a cluster of cases of pneumonia of unknown cause in Wuhan city since December 8, 2019." But it proved otherwise within a month, when India announced a nationwide lockdown for 21 days in March 2020 at the point when approximately 500 cases were reported in the country.

Initially I felt it like a much needed break from the same old routine and relaxing I indulged in all such activities that were pushed aside on priority basis. As weeks turned into a couple of months, the fondness faded and I developed an intense longing to get back to my alma mater. But the situation worldwide had turned quite grim, leaving no chance to unlock in near future. What we saw next was the amplified influence of technology in every field enabling people to stay within the safety of their homes, survive and even thrive.

Following the trend, educational institutions too decided to go digital with the concept of online teaching. This new norm was a challenge for teachers like me. As I started working on it the very thought of not being a tech-savvy, fogged my lens. I was anxious and stressed but not willing to give up. I knew my responsibilities and never wanted to put children's learning at stake. I started my venture preparing audios and videos which kept me awake till late night.

On the first day when I turned my device on and made my entry to the virtual classroom a new session... a new batch... strange silence loomed large. The screen on my mobile which allowed only a few attendees to be visible, displayed one or two familiar faces while others were strange icons of adventure horror, jokes and what not!. Some of them responded to my greetings from behind those figures. I wished I could meet all of them in person.

I missed the clamour, the hustle and bustle and the dynamism of a live class.

I missed the spark of enthusiasm, excitement and anxiety in their eyes.

I missed their playfulness and back bench pranks that kept me engaged and alert.

I missed my chalk-and-talk method of explanations.

I missed my hurried steps from one floor to another and one Class to another.

I missed those break times in the staff-room and the chit-chats with my colleagues over a cup of tea.

And there I was, sitting in my room alone, glued to the chair and speaking to the unseen attendees, many a time baffled by the glitchy software, frozen screen, cracked voices and blurred presentations. It was not a mere digital divide but I knew that I had taken a plunge into the digital abyss.

New dialogues in the tone of questioning, threatening and pleading had crept into the teaching sessions as 'pandemic specials'. "Am I audible?", "Is the page seen clearly on screen?", "Why don't show up your

face? Are you not in uniform?" "I will deduct your marks if you don't upload the complete work on time." "Are you there? Please respond." Please do not message me on my personal wall."

Then in the middle of one of my classes I sensed something amiss. Somebody was kind enough to message me "Ma'am, you are muted by someone! I was appalled at the control they had over me. Were they paying back with interest for all those "keep quiet" commands that we teachers hurled liberally and frequently in the classrooms? I was helpless and dejected looking for a solution. Experts told me that the problem was with my mobile which did not have the vital option "only me", the organiser's privilege. There was no second thought ... a new mobile was purchased. Since the videos and other material consumed more data, to ensure an uninterrupted service, I got Wi-Fi also installed which otherwise was not required for a 'social media-shy' person like me.

Confidence and courage reloaded, I started my mission again. I welcomed the Class to the session in a highly enchanted tone and checked the number of attendees on the other side. I was crest fallen... demoralized. Where are the learners? For what did I spend so much money and energy? As I made an impulsive decision to quit and reached out to the 'End' button, I heard a gentle request from the other side, "Ma'am can you explain Haeber's process once again? I was absent and could not make notes in the last class."

What a joy I experienced!

How soon my frustration vanished into thin air! My chase for listeners ended at that point. I regained my identity as a teacher and not just an organizer. I put my heart and soul for those small fraction of children who were regular, interactive, asking questions, completing work on time and some even taking freedom to give me tips on how to use the App more affectively. Some of them did some spy work too to inform me about the mischiefs others played during the session.

It is because of you child, I turned a blind eye to many of my personal discomforts and uneasiness towards;

...the public viewing of my study,

...presence of those extra attendees with students possibly watching my actions and mannerisms with critical eyes and judging my 'performance',

...the unaccustomed entries and exits of attendees anytime during the class,

...the purposeful unmuting in the thick of the session and letting lose the hell of household noises even from the neighborhood!!!

All these kept disturbing me and it keeps doing the same. But I am sure that this 'pandemic tunnel' is not so long ahead, and rays of light will soon be filtering in. At present let me ascend the few crests of exhilarations and travail the many deep troughs of depressions of my online teaching. Let me gather them in my memory to be cherished as they are once in a life time experience.

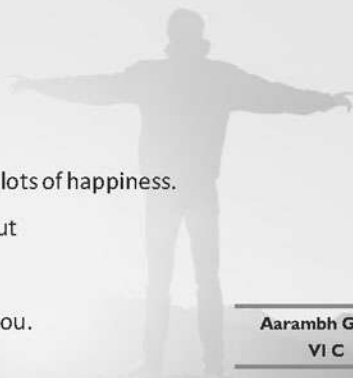

# मातृभाषा हिन्दी का महत्व और उसका संस्कृति से जुड़ाव

सभी जानते हैं कि हिन्दी हमारी मातृभाषा है। लेकिन इसकी जरूरत कितनी है, इस पर कम ही मंथन किया गया है तो उस तथ्य को अपनाने से बचते रहे। इसलिए आज भी कई बार हिन्दी बोलने और उसे लिखने वाले को अंग्रेजी की अपेक्षा दोयम दृष्टि से देखा जाता है। यहाँ ये बताना जरूरी है कि कई ऐसे हिन्दी के लेखक हैं, जिन्होंने विषय की शैक्षणिक विशेषज्ञता तो अंग्रेजी में हासिल की, लेकिन प्रसिद्धी हिन्दी में पाई। हरिवंशराय बच्चन, भीष्म साहनी आदि ऐसी ही विभूतियाँ हैं।



## हिन्दी ही सर्वत्र

कभी गौर कीजिए, सुबह उठने से लेकर देर रात को सोने तक आपने बातों में हिन्दी का कितना इस्तेमाल किया। आप पाएंगे कि करीब 95 फीसदी हिस्सा हिन्दी ही बोली। ये तथ्य एक सर्वे में सामने आया है। यानी हिन्दी के बिना सांस लेने तक मुश्किल है। इसके बिना सुचारू संप्रेषण संभव नहीं। गौर ये भी कीजिए कि हिन्दी कितनी वैज्ञानिक भाषा है। दुनिया की किसी भाषा का कोई भी अक्षर या शब्द बोलने में आपको होंठ, तालु, दांत की ही जरूरत होती है। यानी कोई भी शब्द बोलने के लिए इस्तेमाल की गई ध्वनि हिन्दी में ही होती है। हिन्दी भाषा के महत्व और आवश्यकता का बखान करने के लिए इससे बेहतर और आसान तरीका शायद कुछ नहीं।

## संस्कृतियों का संगम

हिन्दी से देश की विभिन्न संस्कृतियों के जुड़ाव का ताना बाना किस तरह परिलक्षित होता है, ये प्रसिद्ध फिल्म कहानी लेखक जावेद अख्तर के भाषा पर इस संबोधन से सामने आता है, जिसमें वो एक पैराग्राफ में ही विभिन्न संस्कृतियों की बुनावट सामने रखते हैं, देखें –

“एक महान में एक गौरा-चिट्ठा आदमी, एक नन्हा-मुन्ना बच्चा बैठे थे। बावर्ची ने उन्हें नाश्ता लाकर दिया। नाश्ते में उड़द की दाल और टोस्ट थे। नाश्ते में उड़द की दाल और टोस्ट थे। नाश्ते के बाद उसने चिक हटाई। एक संदूक खोला, उसमें से एक पिस्तौल निकाली। दीवार पर टंगी बंदूक उतारी। वो घर से बाहर निकल गया। रास्ते में तेज हवा थी। वो बाल्टी लेकर लौट आया।”

इस पैराग्राफ में चिट्ठा (पंजाबी), नन्हा (गुजराती), बच्चा (फारसी), बावर्ची (तुर्की), नाश्ता (फारसी), चिक (तुर्की), पिस्तौल (अंग्रेजी), संदूक और बंदूक (तुर्की), रास्ता और दीवार (फारसी), उड़द (तमिल), टोस्ट (अंग्रेजी) और बाल्टी (पुर्तगाली) शब्द हैं।

ध्यान दीजिए, ये वो शब्द हैं, जिन्हें हम रोजमर्रा बोलचाल में इस्तेमाल करते हैं। ये वाक्य समायोजन बताता है कि हिन्दी ने अपने अंदर पंजाबी, गुजराती, तमिल, फारसी, तुर्की, अंग्रेजी, पुर्तगाली समेल न जाने कितनी ही संस्कृतियों को आत्मसात कर रखा है। हम इन शब्दों के बिना रह भी नहीं सकते।

हिन्दी के प्रसिद्ध लेखक भारतेन्दु हरिश्चंद्र कहते हैं कि ‘निज भाषा उन्नति है, सब उन्नति को मूल, बिन निज भाषा ज्ञान के, मिटन न हिय के मूल’। मतलब मातृभाषा की उन्नति बिना किसी भी समाज की तरक्की संभव नहीं है तथा अपनी भाषा के ज्ञान के बिना मन की पीड़ा को दूर करना भी मुश्किल है।

ये बताना भी जरूरी है कि चाहे लिपि कई बार बदलकर अब देवनागरी हो गई हो, लेकिन हमारी बोलचाल की भाषा सदैव हिन्दी ही रही। बस इसमें हुआ ये कि दूसरी संस्कृतियों की मिठास भी समय-समय पर घुलती चली गई और ये रोजमर्रा की बोली-बानी में विस्तार लेती गई। अब तो इसका विस्तार इतना दिख रहा है कि हाल ही में अमेरिकी राष्ट्रपति डोनाल्ड ट्रंप ने अहमदाबाद में मोटेरा स्टेडियम में दिए अपने संबोधन में भी बॉलीवुड और शोले, डीडीएलजे जैसे शब्दों का जिक्र कर हिन्द और हिन्दी की महत्ता पर मुहर लगा दी।
